South Lakeland Carers is an independent, local charity and network partner of Carers Trust. We provide a range of services to support and enhance the lives of unpaid carers of all ages throughout South Lakeland.

### Who is a carer?

A carer is someone who, without payment, provides help and support to a parent, partner, child, relative, friend or neighbour, who could not manage without their help. This could be due to age, physical or mental illness, substance misuse or disability.

There are thousands of carers in South Lakeland. Many juggle, work, school, or other commitments along with their caring role, and most don't think of themselves as carers, nor do they realise the range of services available to help them.

The term carer should not be confused with a care worker, or care assistant who receives payment for looking after someone.

Why do carers need support?

Many carers face emotional and financial difficulties. Many have given up their income, education or employment prospects or pension rights to care for someone. Others attempt to juggle jobs and their caring responsibilities. Taking on a caring role can lead to feelings of isolation, frustration, depression and can result in ill health. Access to information, emotional support, advocacy, financial support and opportunities to take a break can help manage the impact of caring on the lives of carers.

Jigsaw, Cumbria's Children's Hospice can provide emotional and physical support for up to six children every day, with the facility for up to five children and young adults staying overnight.

The children's hospice provides one to one care for children and young adults with life limiting illnesses, as well as extending the care and support to their families. Jigsaw's home-from-home environment allows the nurses to match the children and young adults home routine as closely as possible, ensuring a smooth, relaxing and peaceful transition between the home and hospice environments.

#### History

In 2005 Eden Valley Hospice launched the Jigsaw Appeal. Through the support and generosity of individuals, businesses and community groups from throughout Cumbria the appeal reached its £1,000,000 target to replace the existing facility, which provided over night facilities for two children and a day care facility.



In December 2007 the purpose built facility became fully operational and began caring for children from throughout Cumbria. The continued generosity of the local community has allowed Jigsaw, Cumbria's Children's Hospice's dedicated team of nurses and activity coordinators to develop the variety of services provided to children and young adults from throughout Cumbria. On January 24 2014, the children's hospice unveiled a new, vibrant and modern image and name. The launch of the new image was in recognition that the previous name and imagery, Eden House Children's Hospice, did not connect with people throughout Cumbria and was unable to communicate that the children's hospice provides care for families countywide.
